#### Findings

Distraction Index (DI): Right DI = 0.22, Left DI = 0.26.

Osteoarthritis (OA): No radiographic evidence of OA for either hip.


Cavitation/Other Findings: No cavitation present.

#### Interpretation

Distraction Index (DI): The laxity ranking is based on the hip with the greater laxity (larger DI). In this case the DI used is 0.26.

OA Risk Category: The DI is less than or equal to 0.30. This patient is at minimal risk for hip OA. **Distraction Index Chart:** 

## STANDARD POODLE



BREED STATISTICS: This interpretation is based on a cross-section of 6419 canine patients of the STANDARD POODLE breed in the AIS PennHIP database. The gray strip represents the central 90% range of DIs (0.28 - 0.68) for the breed. The breed average DI is 0.46 (solid square). The patient DI is the solid circle (0.26).

**SUMMARY:** The degree of laxity (DI = 0.26) ranks the hip within the tightest 5% of DIs for the breed. This amount of hip laxity places the hip at a minimal risk to develop hip OA. No radiographic evidence of OA for either hip.

**INTERPRETATION AND RECOMMENDATIONS:** No OA/Minimal Risk: Unlikely to show radiographic evidence of hip OA; even more unlikely to develop clinical signs of hip dysplasia. **Recommendations:** Normal to strenuous activity is permitted. Keep lean: try to maintain BCS at 5/9 for a longer and healthier life. **Breeding Recommendations:** Please Consult the PennHIP Manual.
